Celebrating 50 Years of Handbell Ringing!

The current members of the *Robertson-Wesley Ringers* and *Nova Bells* would like to invite you to a special celebration at Robertson-Wesley United Church (10209-123 Street, Edmonton). The *R-W Ringers* will play in the service on Sunday, June 4 at 10:30 am and the service will be followed by an hour-long concert at approximately 11:30 am with the *R-W Ringers* and *Nova Bells*.

This celebration is in honour of the 50th anniversary of handbell ringing at Robertson-Wesley United Church. Robertson United Church, under then Music Director Douglas Millson, was one of the first churches in Canada to get a set of handbells, and what a legacy that purchase has created! In recognition of that history, we have been cited in the article on “Handbells” in the Canadian Encyclopedia of Music <http://www.thecanadianencyclopedia.ca/en/article/handbells-emc/>

Over the last 50 years our handbell ringers have attended and planned several International Handbell Symposia – as individuals or as a whole choir (Vancouver-2016, Australia-2006, Japan-1986), attended provincial and national events, performed at many community, corporate and civic events, and made five recordings.

A special invitation has been extended to all alumni handbell ringers and directors, as well as audience members to join us in this celebration. As part of our recognition of Canada’s 150th, the concert will be comprised of music of Canadian composers or music that has special connections with Canada, and an extra special feature of the concert will be the premiere of a work commissioned from Betty B. Radford for the event. The concert will begin at approximately 11:30 am on Sunday, June 4.

Under the tutelage of Dr. Payn and Camille Ream, handbell ringers from across North America will spend four days of intensive rehearsals, developing their musicality, timing and techniques in preparation for this event.

They will present a wide variety of pieces - Aquarius / Let the Sun Shine In, Good Christian Men Rejoice, Exodus, Fly Me to the Moon and several of Dr. Payn's own compositions.

The concert is at St. Albert United Church, 20 Green Grove Drive, Saturday July 29, 2017 at 7:30 pm.
